## Louise Lind-af-Hageby

Louise Lind-af-Hageby (1878-1963)

Louise Lind-af-Hageby was born in Sweden, the daughter of a lawyer, and is in our book of remembrance which is on view opposite the portrait of Mrs St. Clair Stobart (1862-1954).

She was the main instigator of the first of two international anti-vivisectionist congresses held in London in July 1909. In the First World War, Louise Lind-af-Hageby founded the Purple Cross Service, authorized by the French war office, for sick and wounded warhorses. She continued to promote the welfare of animals affected by war during the 1920s and 1930s and during the Second World War. Her implacable opposition to scientific use of animals continued throughout her life.
